

Overview of “Plurilingual and Pluricultural Studies”

“Plurilingual and Pluricultural Studies” is a liberal arts program for economics students. It begins with the study of a second foreign language and delves into research on the language, culture and society of the relevant geographical region. Through this program, students will be able to gain a broad education in addition to their expertise in economics, raise awareness of diversity in the world, hone their multifaceted thinking skills, and develop a global mindset suitable for future leaders.

To complete this program, students are required to successfully finish mandatory second foreign language courses and deepen their understanding of the culture and social issues of specific regions through approved lectures. Furthermore, they must either submit an academic paper as part of an Independent Research Project or study abroad with a faculty approval in one of the aforementioned specific regions.

Completion requirements:

- 1) 8 credits for mandatory second foreign language courses
- 2) More than 8 credits for approved lecture and seminar courses
- 3) Independent Research Project / Study abroad in a specific linguistic region

Four program tracks will be opened in 2026: German, French, Chinese and Spanish. Please refer to [each course's information](#) including the teaching staff in charge of Independent Research Project, completion requirements and the list of exchange program destinations.

Enrollment requirements and application guidelines will be released on April 1, 2026. This program is open to students currently enrolled in the Faculty of Economics, and credits acquired during previous academic years may be applied.
